

# Air Quality Levels and Procedures

We use the following website to watch the air quality for our area: <https://www.airnow.gov/>. This is a new challenge for camps in Michigan so we are in regular communication with our camp physician, Dr. Emily Soni, who is working with us to adapt the camp program as needed based on the air quality level our area is at.

**Our plan and adaptations are as follows:**

**Any air quality level- We are monitoring the health of all campers and staff at all times.**

## **Orange- Unhealthy for sensitive groups- 101-150**

- We are monitoring the health of the campers and staff with asthma and making adaptations for those folks as needed. We do have N95 masks available to those staff and campers that may need it.

## **Red- Unhealthy- 151-200**

- We are monitoring the health of the campers and staff with asthma and making adaptations for those folks as needed. We do have N95 masks available to those staff and campers that may need it.
- We are limiting running activities and have indoor program options for those that need it.

## **Purple- Very unhealthy- 201-300**

- We are monitoring the health of the campers and staff with asthma and making adaptations for those folks as needed. We do have N95 masks available to those staff and campers that may need it.
- We will not have any running activities and reduce our physical activity.
- We will eat meals indoors.

## **Maroon- Hazardous- 301 or higher**

- We will move all campers and staff indoors and adapt program to be inside
- Our indoor spaces that we will use are Focus Hall, The Lodge, and our Dining Hall
- If we are sleeping in the cabins we will close all the windows and keep fans on
